





unjust actions of government at public meetings as well as in print, and became associated with the radical Land Reform League of 1855. (ADB). Ferguson 7102.

The motoring and tourist guides in the following section come from the family of the publisher G. R. Broadbent. Broadbent contributed regularly to the Argus and Australasian on both cycling and touring and, in December 1903, attended the meeting which established the (Royal) Automobile Club of Victoria. As an active official in the Good Roads Association of Victoria from 1912 he was involved in the preparation of the Country Roads Bill. Writing tirelessly on road improvements and maintenance, he became manager of the Automobile Club's new touring department in 1914. See also item number 72. (Schwaebsch)

In preparation for a move from Launceston in 1834 James Henty approached the Colonial Office seeking permission in Edward's name to purchase 20,000 acres on the mainland on terms over ten years. The government's answer of May 1835 declined the purchase, but Lord Aberdeen did concede that I am not prepared to say that Mr. Henty's pretensions to any land, actually brought into cultivation by him and surrounded by a proper fence, would be not favourably looked upon by His Majesty's Government at a future period, should the increase of the population of New South Wales, or other circumstances, extend the settlement of the territory to the quarter where Mr. Henty may have established himself. This was sufficient encouragement for Edward to persevere in the new farming venture.


Within four years father and sons occupied six stations, with 135 acres of the Portland run fenced. Farm-houses and roads had been constructed, and the total value of their improvements was estimated at £8000 to £10,000. When Thomas Mitchell visited in 1836 he

wrote It was very obvious indeed from the magnitude and extent of the buildings, and the substantial fencing erected, that both time and labour had been expended in their construction. A good garden stocked with abundance of vegetables already smiled on Portland Bay: the soil was very rich on the overhanging cliffs, and the potatoes and turnips produced here, surpassed in magnitude and quality any I had ever seen elsewhere. I learnt that the bay was much resorted to by vessels engaged in the whale fishery... Messrs. Henty were importing sheep and cattle as fast as vessels could bring them over, and the numerous whalers touching at or fishing there, were found to be good customers for farm produce and whatever else could be spared from the establishment.

The Sydney government's refusal in 1840 to recognise the Hentys as anything other than unauthorized occupiers was the catalyst for the new claim launched with this Statement, made by the sons following Edward's death in 1839. Once the township of Portland Bay had been surveyed a land sale of the allotments took place in Melbourne in 1840. Extraordinarily high prices were achieved for property in a population of 100 where half of the residents were employed by the Hentys, in a location 150 miles distant from the nearest Government town. The government soon commenced proceedings to eject the brothers from some of their holdings. A lengthy legal process finally produced a

decision in 1846, allowing the Messrs. Henty to retain eleven acres of town land at £100 an acre, or about a quarter of what the land had fetched at the 1840 Melbourne sale. Ferguson, 3229.





The elaborate decoration has at its head a watercolour showing the first view of Melbourne in 1839 from the River Yarra, and at its foot an original albumen paper print (with slight restoration at outer right corner) circa 1895, a view taken from the tower of Government House overlooking factories and warehouses on the site of what is now Southbank, with the spires and commercial buildings of the city in the distance.

The watercolour panels are, at left a bushland scene, and at right The Buffalo Ranges.

The two small insets on the signature leaf are Site of the Proposed Settlement, Sorrento, 1803, and a hunting scene. With a career spanning forty-one years, Callanan was closely involved in the progress of Melbourne's development from the time of the gold rushes.


